

DERWENT

DRAWING SCULPTURES

Derwent Graphitint Pencils

Grade Level: 5-12

MATERIALS:

- Derwent Graphitint Pencils, Set of 12
- Watercolour Paper
- Derwent Waterbrushes, 4 Pack
- Masking Tape
- Kneaded Eraser

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

Students will work with Derwent Graphitint to refine their use of values and shading by drawing monochromatic sculptures from either a photo or real-life sculpture.



PROCEDURE:

- 1 Tape your watercolour paper down to your work surface. Draw your sculpture.



- 2 Shade the sculpture with dry Graphitint pencils. We recommend using one colour such as Midnight Black or Cloud Grey (we used Dark Indigo) so you get a full range of values with a bit of colour.



- 3 Activate the Graphitint pigments by adding water with a waterbrush. Lift out colour if you need to lighten, or erase, as you see fit after the pigment is dry.



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- 4 Add details with a dry Graphitint pencil on dry paper.



- 5 If needed, adjust values. Blend by smudging with your fingers or with water and a brush. Be careful not to lift previous layers.

Pro Tip: Try using warm colours for highlights and cool colours for shadows to create more colourful dimensions.
